### **Calculating Your HWQ**

- Rate yourself on each component on a scale of 1-5.
- Multiply each rating by a weight reflecting its importance (weights customizable).
- Sum weighted scores to get an overall HWQ score.
- Use the score to identify strengths and areas needing more meaningful effort.

### **Applying the HWQ Framework**

- Set clear, challenging, and aligned development goals.
- Track effort quality weekly or monthly.
- Reflect on progress and adjust strategies.
- Share HWQ insights with coaches or peers for accountability.
- Celebrate meaningful effort milestones, not just outcomes.
